Cucumber (Cucumis sativus)

A summer without cucumbers is no summer at all, in my opinion. So many summer salads require its crunchy freshness. Even on its own, peeled and cubed and tossed in some olive oil and balsamic vinegar, it makes a refreshing salad.

Grow it in rich soil with a regular supply of water. It will produce more fruit, if it is grown over a frame. It is a vine and it will grow quite large, if you give it the chance. The larger the plant, the more cucumbers there will be!

The seeds can be sown in soil that has plenty of organic matter, in mid to late spring. Plant the two or three seeds in a mound.
